JAMES D. MATHIAS MEMORIAL AWARD

The Quality Deer Management Association (QDMA) is a non-profit wildlife conservation organization dedicated to ensuring the future of white-tailed deer, wildlife habitat and our hunting heritage.

Founded in 1988, the QDMA has nearly 50,000 members in all 50 states and several foreign countries. Since the beginning, QDMA has worked to educate its members and all deer hunters about the benefits of the Quality Deer Management (QDM) philosophy. This effort – aided by the support of numerous member-volunteers, corporate sponsors, and other QDM advocates – has rapidly increased awareness and implementation of QDM throughout North America, resulting in healthier, more balanced deer populations and more rewarding hunting experiences. As it grew in membership and influence, QDMA also began working to secure a sustainable future for wild white-tailed deer through practical research and by advocating for wise policy and regulation that will protect our hunting heritage. Additionally, QDMA works to attract, assist, educate and guide young and new hunters to ensure they become tomorrow's stewards of whitetails and all wildlife.

The QDMA promotes:

- Safe and ethical hunting.
- Adherence to wildlife and trespass laws.
- Appropriate harvests of adult does where needed.
- Restraint in harvesting young bucks.
- Hunter involvement in education and management.
- Cooperation with wildlife biologists and enforcement officers.
- Education of hunters and non-hunters toward a better understanding of wildlife management.
- Stewardship and appreciation of all wildlife.

The Pennsylvania National Pike Branch of QDMA not only believes in hunting the whitetail but also in caring for it through the four cornerstones of QDMA: herd management, habitat management, herd monitoring and hunter management. In order to support the four cornerstones, the Pennsylvania National Pike Branch of QDMA has established an award to encourage the youth of today to become the leaders of tomorrow in white-tail deer management.

The James D. Mathias Memorial Award is being offered in memory of a devoted sportsman who dedicated his life to helping young people reach their full potential. James was a hunter, youth

coach in baseball and football, volunteer with the Farmington Fire Department and a loving father and husband. It is in his honor that this award is presented to the future leaders.

The Pennsylvania National Pike Branch of QDMA will make the James D. Mathias Memorial Awards available to high school seniors based on the counties serviced by the Pennsylvania National Pike Branch. Seniors may apply for the award based on the following guidelines:

- The student must be a senior in high school.
- The student can only apply once in their educational career for the award.
- The student must reside in Fayette or Westmoreland County (one award per county).
- The student must have an overall high school grade point average of 3.0 GPA.
- The student must have a maintained an overall 95% attendance record.
- The student must demonstrate leadership and citizenship that exemplifies the American spirit and a respect for the outdoors.
- The student must major in a program that will benefit animals of the wild (white-tail deer, ect), plants/trees of the wild, law-enforcement of the wild or fields of study that will help to improve the natural resources related to benefiting white-tail deer.

To apply for the award, students must submit all of the following:

- 1. Complete the attached application, including a 300 to 500 word essay. Select from the topics listed on the essay form.
- 2. One written reference from a faculty member. This can be a teacher, coach, sponsor or administrator.
- 3. Plan to attend an accredited technical or career school, college or university. Proof of acceptance required (copy of acceptance letter, ect.).
- 4. Provide an official copy of the student's High School transcript and a copy of the student's report card for the first three grading periods (if possible, two minimum) of the student's senior year.

The Pennsylvania National Pike Branch of QDMA selection committee will select make a decision based on the information submitted and will make the presentation of the award during the High School's Award Event. Payment of the award will be made directly to the student.

Attention: John Hustosky, Sr. The application materials must be received by third Monday in April. Missing the due date or any missing application material will disqualify the student from competing for the scholarship.
